

Memorandum of Support Unemployment Bridge Program (S3192 / A4821)

February 14, 2023

Over **100** participating labor, community, immigrant, freelance and carceral justice organizations issue a memorandum of support for the Unemployment Bridge Program carried by **Senator Jessica Ramos** and **Assemblywoman Karines Reyes.** The Unemployment Bridge Program is a revenue-neutral, sustainable program that will help thousands of low-to-moderate income freelancers, cash earners, self-employed workers, immigrants and people in re-entry get access to unemployment compensation when they lose their job for no fault of their own.

The revenue-neutral program would cost \$500 million and would be resourced through the Digital Ad Tax sponsored by Senator Gianaris which collects a small portion of annual revenues of digital advertising services from companies whose gross annual revenues from these services is \$100 million or more. The Unemployment Bridge Program will bring in <u>economic returns</u> upwards of hundreds of millions across regions in New York state. Unlike NYS state unemployment insurance which has racial inequities built in, this program would serve <u>73 percent</u> of people who are non-white.

The following organizations strongly urge that this legislation be included in the New York State SFY 2023-24 budget.
